Workshops

Lairnin aboot* Ulster-Scots

We can offer a variety of free workshops to both primary and post-primary pupils covering aspects of history, culture and language.

These can be delivered to individual classes, year groups or school assemblies, and can be adapted to suit your needs or to fit in with current topic work.

Tutors can teach some country or highland dance steps, about the origins of the Lambeg Drum or Highland Bagpipes. Pupils can learn about the history of the Ulster-Scots and can explore the Ulster-Scots language.

Workshops are all interactive, with pupils being encouraged to participate, ask questions, play games, have a go a speaking some pure Ulster-Scots.

After-Schools

If your school has already had an Ulster-Scots taster session or workshop, and are still keen to provide more Ulster-Scots for your pupils, an After-schools club might suit you.

The club is designed to make children aware of the Ulster-Scots culture that is prevalent in their lives yet unknown by many.

The scheme runs for six weeks and is held once per week on a day that suits the school. Each session will bring an introduction to a different performance that might include, snare drumming, Living History, Lambegs, Scottish Country Dancing, Drama, Highland Dancing, Story Telling, the Ulster-Scots Language and Bagpipes.

Encouraging your pupils to use and celebrate Ulster-Scots words and phrases is an important way to keep the language alive and give pupils a sense of pride in their own words.
